On Dec. 15, the Winter Freeze Shelter will welcome its guests for the first of 90 consecutive nights, including Christmas eve and New Year's eve. It is a privilege to serve them

This is the 10th year we have offered this service in our community. We have welcomed more than 1,000 people during that time. Their needs are many; their distress palpable.
