




Youth Services System FY09 Services: 2840 youth and families served

The Good Samaritan

Good Samaritan Honoree—Ron Mulholland



Ron Mulholland is a tireless advocate for young people. He was the founding executive director for Youth Services System, Inc. (YSS) starting in 1974. This northern panhandle organization's first service was to provide emergency shelter for those who needed. At the time, there was no process to do this, since there were no emergency shelters—YSS's Samaritan House would become the first licensed shelter. Starting with a building lent to him by the Diocese of Wheeling-Charleston and volunteers, Ron worked to bring resources and innovation to the care of young people.

Emergency shelter led to alternative education programs and to programs to teach older adolescents the skills they needed to live independently. Ron's vision was to offer young men and women an array of paths towards health and success. .

His vision was wide-ranging—from a public campaign and program to help young runaways leave the exploitation of street prostitution to service on the state level and federal level with the national Office on Juvenile Justice and Delinquency Prevention. he has sought to bring people together in service to kids and families. Ron Mulholland's work was recognized nationally when he received the Lewis Hine Award from the National Child Labor Committee

From its start as a one person service organization, Youth Services System has grown into a diverse youth-serving agency. For 23 years, YSS has operated the Northern Regional Juvenile Center as West Virginia's only private juvenile facility. Other services like independent living for youth in foster care are among the state's most experienced youth programs. Sixteen thousand youth have received the care and services from the organization that Ron Mulholland began. Many others throughout West Virginia have benefited from his firm conviction that each child has worth, dignity and a place in the world.
